THE WALLACE COLLECTION

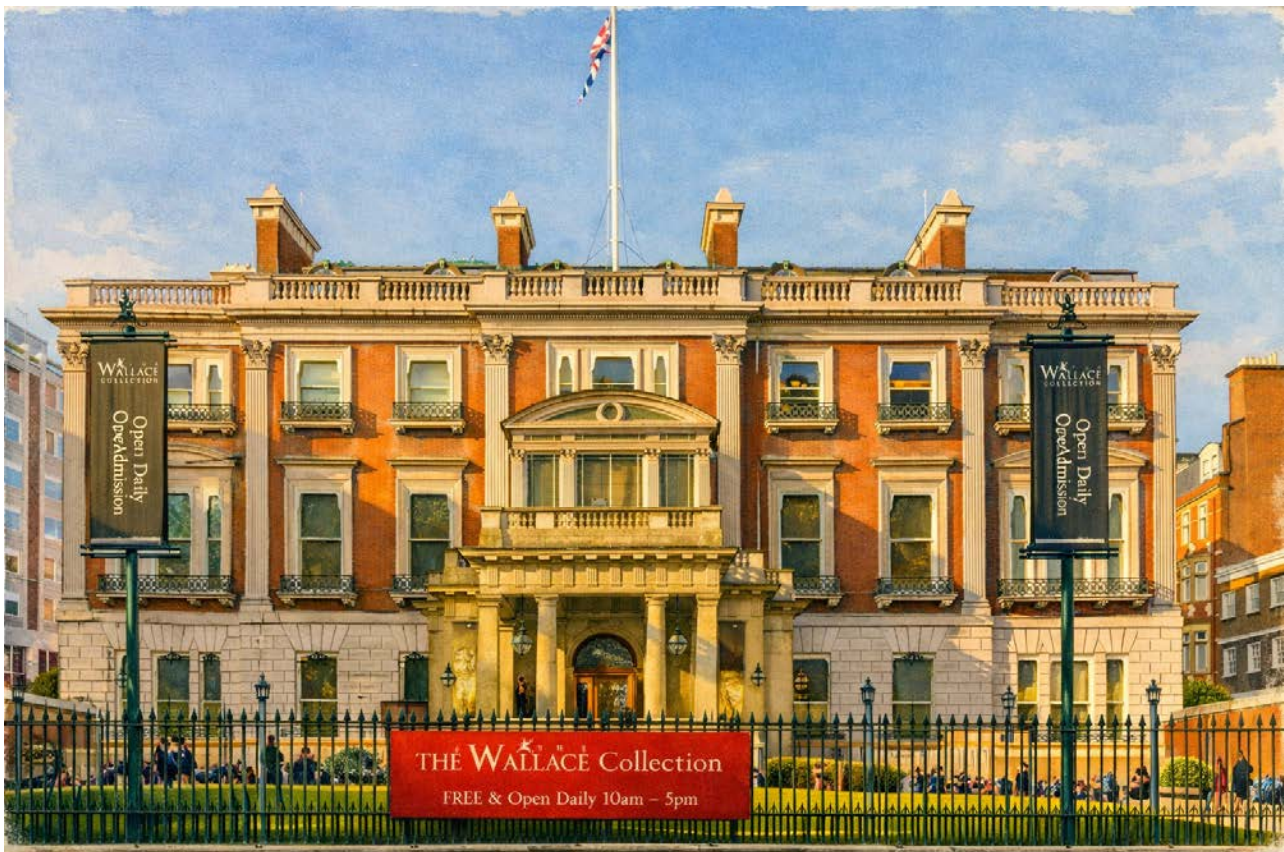
Hertford House, Manchester Square. FREE entry. 25 galleries French paintings, furniture, art 15th-19th centuries. Hals Laughing Cavalier. Titian, Velazquez, Rembrandt Titus portrait, Fragonard The Swing. French 18th-century decorative arts world's finest. Armoury collection spectacular. Courtyard restaurant photogenic, glamorous. Quieter alternative big museums. Human-scale, soft light, old masters people actually return to. Hidden gem historic townhouse. Lady Wallace bequeathed British nation 1897, open since 1900.

WIGMORE HALL

World-famous concert hall. Chamber music, song recitals. Acoustics legendary. Intimate 550-seat venue. Sunday morning coffee concerts popular. Pre/post-concert dining nearby. Classical music heart London.

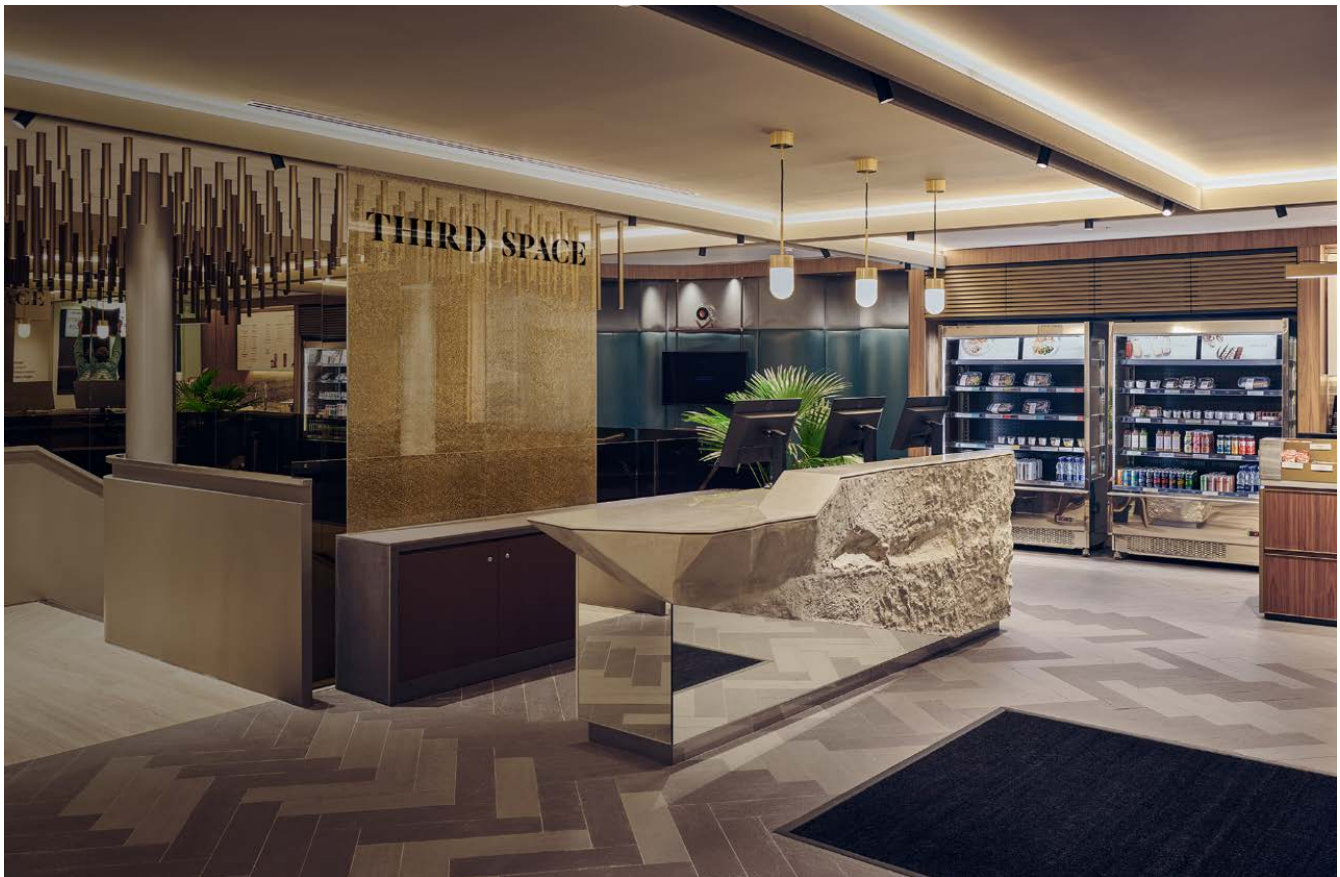

Market Energy

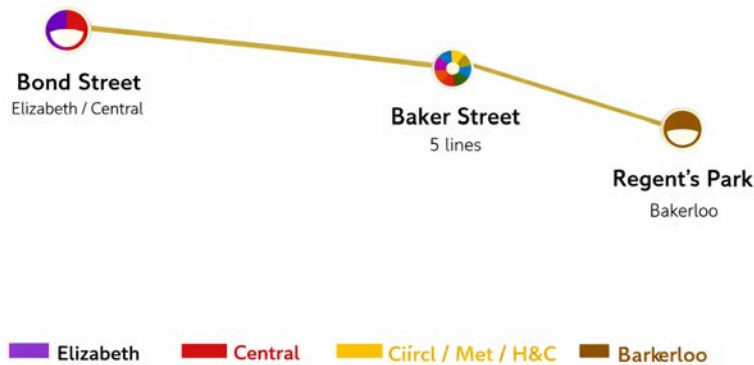
